GALA BOARD RETREAT 2018— UNDER RE-CONSTRUCTION

Your GALA board met January 19th through 21st at the Temple in Independence, MO for some time of reflection of the past, updating ourselves on our present and dreaming about our future.

Our schedule was jammed packed. The retreat planning committee consisted of John, Parker, Brittany and me. Balancing the spiritual needs with the organizational needs was a delicate balance. Each day we held 3 devotions - each morning before we started, each day at 1pm the Temple Prayer for Peace and a closing devotion each night to re-ground us in our efforts. Day 1 was about sharing our stories, Day 2 was a day of dreaming about our future and Day 3 was our regular business meeting for January.

But what did you accomplish you ask?

We agreed there are 9 critical areas for our focus. They are: Mission and Purpose, Finances, Membership, Communications, Policies, Resources, Education, Events and Risk Management.

This year we are focusing on the following:

Mission and Purpose: Updating our internal and external brand image and evaluating a re-joining of GALA and WCN.

Communication: Developing and delivering stories and resources to you in a way that is most user friendly to you. The newsletter will be published in February, May, August and November.

Policies and Procedures: It's time to update our organizational by-laws to ensure we are using non-profit best practices and what makes sense for us. We are also putting together a "Pride Protocol" for congregations wanting to participate in LGBTQ+ pride events.

International Retreat Location: we will be returning to Camp Redcliffe outside of Salt Lake City, Utah. Save the dates of August 31st through September 3rd in the beautiful mountains of Utah.

MEET JOHN BILLINGS, TREASURER

- Make payments of funds as directed by the board and organization.
- Oversee the budget as approved by the organization and provide reports of income and expenses on a regular basis to the board and membership.
- Give direction to fund raising and donations to the organization.

These are basic tasks of the treasurer. But, I also see my responsibilities in a broader context. I am a member of the board which has the responsibility to provide leadership to GALA. It's about looking at the future of GALA and how best this organization can live out its purpose and mission. It is about providing welcome and a social venue for the GALA family. This board is looking forward to moving GALA forward without forgetting where we have come from and why we began. We still want to bring ministry to those who have been hurt and disenfranchised. I am excited to be a part of the GALA board!
