Parting Thoughts

This is my final month on the GALA board as my term as Vice President has come to a close.

My biggest takeaway from these three terms on the GALA board is the importance of relationships. We are tied together in really important ways, many of us because of shared heritage through the Community of Christ and shared experience in our identities in the LGBTQ community or as allies.

One of the ways that we are working together to further connections and build relationships is through the GALA Table Facebook page. We have also gotten several requests to share contact information with the group of participants from the GALA International Annual Retreat. Since we did not ask ahead of time for permission to share this information, we won't be able to share everyone's contact information. However, the board has decided that we will ask in advance next year and make it a policy to share contact information after retreats (for those who give permission).

I also want to encourage everyone to remember that relationships are the most important part of our work together. It is through relationships that we heal old wounds and self-hate, build resilience to handle difficult times, and support each other through personal struggles. I beg people to reach out to each other where those relationships have been injured and seek reconciliation.

I think with all the oppression and conflict we are seeing in the world, it is easy to point fingers at each other instead of focusing on the bigger forces that are at work in the world.

Thank you for those who are continuing to lead us in our work through GALA board service. This work is not glamorous and board members often get more complaints than complements. However, it is important work and I am grateful for your service. I think GALA is in a really strong place and the current board is poised to take the organization forward into the future. We will be even stronger if we can forgive each other and work together for the good of the community.
